SPECIALISED RULES OF PROCEDURE

1936 Spanish Civil War

INFORMAL MEETINGS

- 1. To convene an Informal Meeting, delegates have to pass a note to the Dais containing the following information:
 - a. Names of invited delegates
 - b. Duration of meeting
 - c. Agenda of meeting;
- 2. An Informal Meeting can be convened at any time during a GSL, with the following rules:
 - a. A maximum of 5 delegates can attend an Informal Meeting
 - b. A maximum of 1 Informal Meeting can be convened at any point in time
 - c. The maximum duration for an Informal Meeting is 10 minutes
 - d. Informal Meetings will be convened outside of the council room in the presence of one of the Dais
 - e. Invited delegates can choose to decline the invite and remain in the GSL
 - f. Approval of Informal Meetings is subject to the Dais' discretion;
- 3. Should delegates wish to convene an Informal Meeting across cabinets between the Nationalists and Republicans, they are to submit a directive coordinating this meeting instead

ESPIONAGE

- A Motion to Commission Espionage can be introduced to carry out Espionage on the other Council in the Joint Cabinet Crisis, with the following procedures:
 - a. Upon successful introduction of the motion, Council will move directly into procedural voting, which requires a simple majority to pass;
- Upon passing the Motion to Commission Espionage, Dais of the other cabinet will record a 1-minute segment of the council session, with the following restrictions:
 - a. Delegates will not have a choice of specific segments or delegates to carry out Espionage on
 - b. Upon procuring the recording, Dais will pause the Council Session to play the recording once
 - c. Motions to Commission Espionage should be used more than 3 times a day for each cabinet to the chairs discretion;

COMBINED COUNCIL SESSIONS

- 1. A Motion to enter Combined Council Sessions can be introduced by delegates from either cabinet to combine both cabinets into one council in the same venue with the General Speakers List.
 - a. Upon successful introduction of the motion, the cabinet will move into procedure voting, which requires a simple majority for the motion to take effect.
- Once a simple majority has been reached, the motion will be brought to the floor of the other cabinet and delegates of the other cabinet will need a two-thirds majority in their vote for the Combined Council Sessions to be passed.
- 3. Once the motion is passed, both councils will move into a combined General Speakers List whereby delegates from both cabinets will be able to speak on the General Speakers List and raise points and motions.
- 4. Should any cabinet wish to elapse the Combined Council Session, at least half of the cabinet should request to the chairs for the elapse of the Combined Council Session, which will take effect immediately.
